On September 18, 2022, the John Whitmer Historical Association (JWHA) will celebrate its 50th anniversary, honoring a half century of promoting the study of Restoration history. This celebration is 50 years in the making. The 2019 Board of Directors set a goal to raise \$50,000 (50kforthe50th) from contributions and sponsorships to support this landmark golden jubilee celebration. Funds raised will be applied to the celebration and encourage new member involvement. A portion of the funds, as designated by the donor, can be committed to our endowment preserving our future stability. As of December 31, 2021, we have commitments and pledges of \$28,005 towards our goal of \$50,000.

JWHA encourages interest in Latter Day Saints history.


