

In 1881, Heman C. Smith, born in Zodiac, 1850, visited Zodiac Cemetery with family and friends. He noted only wooden rails and broken tombstones remained of the final resting place of those several dozen people from the extinct frontier community. Those there gathered to remember the passed souls and the once material community, Smith noted, that those gathered as well as those who in the future did so were the spiritual heirs of the indomitable frontier spirit and will of the pioneer. Zodiac cemetery reminds us that even when mortal flesh has perished and all that is left is splinters and crushed masonry, the stubborn will and spirit of humanity always continue.

Lymam Wight was buried here March 3, 1858.
